## **VIRTUAL COFFEE WITH NEW PWD DIRECTOR MERINO SET FOR MARCH 29**

Amberrose Merino will hold a Facebook Live event on March 29 to introduce herself to her constituents and answer questions from the public.

The virtual event will allow PWD customers to get to know Director Merino who joined the Board during the COVID-19 pandemic.

“I want to get to know the PWD customers despite the pandemic that has kept us all socially distanced,” Director Merino said. “I know that

transparency and accountability are critical to folks, especially since the Board meetings have been virtual all year. I want to be as transparent as possible. I look forward to joining everyone on Facebook Live.”

The Antelope Valley has been the Director’s home since her family moved from Loma Linda in San Bernardino County while she was in elementary school. After graduating from Rosamond High School, she advanced from painting airplane parts to becoming the second female welder at Kinkisharyo Train Factory. Later, she became the first female welder at McWhirter Steel in Lancaster. She was elected in November 2020 to her first four-year term on the Board.

Director Merino represents Division 1, which roughly borders Avenue P to the north, Avenue R to the south, 35th Street to the east, and Highway 14 to the west.
